The One who caused water to flow out of a rock in the desert is able to provide clean water still today. The One who raised a widow's son from the dead is still able to overcome child mortality. He is active and involved in our world. He moves communities out of poverty, restores abusive marriages, heals illnesses and addictions, and brings good out of hardships. For both suffering people and those seeking to help, there is no higher calling or better hope than depending on God and obeying His word.
