Some have been disappointed in the past—too many wells are sitting broken and unusable, too many projects have been left unfinished by well-meaning outsiders. They've learned not to hope in the promises of NGOs or government.

The Bible tells us that God is to be our source of hope. No matter the circumstances, we can hope in God. He never forsakes us. He is able to bring change. When people trapped in poverty gain hope that God might help them change their circumstances, they begin to look for solutions to problems they have lived with for generations.
